

Statement of website accessibility for private individuals pursuant to Article 3 paragraph 1-bis of Italian Law No. 4 of 9 January 2004



Statement

Partially compliant

This website is partially compliant with the requirements of Annex A of the UNI CEI EN 301549 standard. This is due to the following points of non-compliance:



Non-accessible content

The content listed below is not accessible for the following reasons: non-compliance with Italian Law No. 4 of 9 January 2004:

- Requirement: 9.1.1.1 Some non-text content presented to the user has no equivalent textual alternative that serves the same purpose;
- Requirement: 9.1.3.1 In some cases, information, structure, and relationships conveyed through presentation cannot be programmatically determined (or are not available in text);
- Requirement: 9.1.4.1 In some cases, colour has been used as the only means of identifying a purpose or distinguishing information or function;
- Requirement: 9.1.4.3 The visual representation of text and images of text does not always have the required minimum contrast ratio, with the exceptions provided for in the regulations (e.g. logos);
- Requirement: 9.1.4.4 Certain texts, with the exception of captions and images of text, cannot be resized without assistive technology up to 200 percent without loss of content or functionality;
- Requirement: 9.1.4.5 In some cases, images of text have been used instead of text alone and are neither customisable nor essential to the type of information conveyed;

- Requirement: 9.1.4.13 In some cases, when pointer hover or keyboard focus triggers additional content to become visible and then hidden, there is no mechanism available to dismiss the additional content without moving pointer hover or keyboard focus, the pointer cannot be moved over the additional content without the additional content disappearing, or the additional content remains visible until the hover or focus trigger is removed, the user dismisses it, or its information is no longer valid, with some exceptions provided;
- Requirement: 9.2.1.1 Some functions are not operable through a keyboard (or interface with similar input);
- Requirement: 9.2.2.1 There is a time-dependent element or event for which none of the following is possible: turn off time limit before it is reached, adjust limit, cannot be extended at least ten times, user is not warned before time expires, unless exceptions are provided for in legislation;
- Requirement: 9.2.2.2 For certain moving, blinking, scrolling or auto-updating information that starts automatically, lasts longer than five seconds or is presented in parallel with other content, there are no mechanisms to pause, stop or hide it;
- Requirement: 9.2.3.1 Some pages contain objects that flash more than three times in one second;
- Requirement: 9.2.4.2 Some web pages do not have titles describing their topic or purpose;
- Requirement: 9.2.4.3 On some web pages that can be navigated sequentially and where the navigation sequences affect meaning or operation, some focusable components do not receive focus in an order that preserves meaning and operability;
- Requirement: 9.2.4.4 The purpose of certain links cannot be determined from the link text alone or from the link text together with adjacent content;
- Requirement: 9.2.4.5 In some cases there is either no way or only one way to locate a web page within a set of web pages;
- Requirement: 9.2.4.6 Headings and/or labels do not sufficiently clarify topic or purpose;
- Requirement: 9.2.4.7 On some interactive elements, the focus indicator is not visible;

- Requirement: 9.2.5.3 For some user interface components with labels that include text or images of text, the name read by assistive technologies does not contain the text that is presented visually;
- Requirement: 9.3.2.1 When certain components of the user interface receive focus, a change of context occurs;
- Requirement: 9.3.2.2 When the user changes the setting of any user interface component (input), a change of context occurs;
- Requirement: 9.3.2.3 Some of the navigational mechanisms that are repeated on multiple web pages within a set of web pages do not occur in the same relative order;
- Requirement: 9.3.2.4 Some components that have the same functionality within a set of web pages are not identified consistently;
- Requirement: 9.3.3.2 In some cases, no labels or instructions are provided when content requires user input;
- Requirement: 9.4.1.1 Page markup code does not always conform to its specification or contains errors, or duplicate attributes and IDs;
- Requirement: 9.4.1.2 In some cases, user interface components (including form elements, links and components generated by scripts), names, roles, states, properties and values are not correct or set, or the user and their assistive technologies are not notified when these change;
- Requirement: 9.4.1.3 In some cases, status messages are not presented to the user in such a way that assistive technologies can interpret them without receiving focus;
- Requirement: 10.1.1.1 Some non-text content presented to the user has no equivalent textual alternative that serves the same purpose;
